

FAQs about InTown Soccer

- How Do I register? - It's best to use your computer rather than your smartphone. Go to Lsclub.com and look for the yellow button on the top right that says "Registration".
- How are teams formed? - In grades 1-2, teams are formed by the club. They are also formed by the club for 7-9 Girls and HS COED. The other grades will have drafts conducted by the club with the coaches for the age group.
- May I make a friend request?- The following divisions are allowed friend requests: 1-2 Girls, 1 Boys, 7-9 Girls, and Girls playing in HS Coed. We encourage all players to make new friends on the fields! It builds resilience and self esteem. They are not honored in the other grades.
- Can I switch my child's team?- Sorry, we do not switch teams for children once the teams are formed. It disrupts the balance and even numbers that help make the experience more fun for everyone playing.
- When/where are practices scheduled?- The practice schedule and location (based on field availability) are determined by the volunteer coach once the teams are formed or drafted. This is a plus for the volunteers who take on this important role. Coaches will be able to sign-up for fields beginning September 1st.
- What happens if my child cannot make the practice time or day?- We encourage all parents to be flexible and do their best to have their child at practice. (Remember, coaches decide the day and there are no team switches allowed.) Coaches will not penalize a child who is not at practice with less playing time during games.
- If I coach, may I make a request for an assistant coach? Absolutely! We do our best to pair coaches that make mutual requests for each other.
- May I ask for a refund once I have signed my child up?- Yes, but only before **August 1st.**
- When does the season start? The weekend after Labor Day.

- When are the games played? Weekends with occasional games during the week for grades 3-12 – see last year’s schedule as an example

- When will I/how do I find out my team? Teams are formed after mid-August, you will be contacted by the coach but can also see team assignments by using the Demosphere App that can be loaded on your smart or android phone.

- When will I/how do I find out my coach’s name & contact information? Check the Demosphere App! It allows emails and chats between players and coaches.
- Why is a late fee charged? Uniforms and equipment are ordered in early July based on the numbers that have registered. When you register late, we pay more for extra items to outfit your athlete. Only one late fee is charged per family and waivers are offered for new residents.
- Who can I contact if I have a question? “Ask three then me,” applies here too! First, read these FAQs, then your coach, then the [grade coordinator](#). If this still doesn’t help ask the then head of InTown. The last person to email is the president. [List of Contacts](#)
- When is the latest I can register – If space allows on the team, you may register right up to the start of the season in September. Some grades close earlier than that and you may be put on a waitlist.
- What is the Carpini Cup? Season ending tournament named after the founder of our club Phil Carpini for grades 3-12
- What are the requirements to be a coach? All coaches complete a Background Check and Safety Training. This protects our players and our coaches. We encourage parents, relatives, and even High School students to volunteer!
- What are the responsibilities of a head coach vs assistant coach? Assistant coach helps the head coach with running a weekly practice and game day coaching
- Can I play intown and travel soccer? No, we don’t allow this. InTown is for everyone and we encourage players of all abilities. Teams are formed to include players of all abilities. Travel players are committed to their practices and games and often forgo an InTown practice or game in favor of the Travel practice/game. Teams win when the more skilled players are there and then

lose when they are not. This ruins the experience for all the players.

Additionally, travel trainers do not want their athletes to play on InTown teams.

- Who decides if fields are closed? Town of Livingston makes the decision based on weather/field conditions
- Are there any programs outside of the Fall season? Yes, there are clinics and camps that we will send out information about throughout the year
